LETTER FROM THE BOARD

In the cinematic world, this has been the year of “Girl Rising,” a powerful and provocative film which tells the stories of nine young women from various countries around the globe and documents the “strength of the human spirit and the power of education to change a girl and the world.” While the film’s narrative is global in scope, it is also very much the story of what Our Sisters’ School has been accomplishing right here in New Bedford!

Looking back at our recently-concluded fifth year, it is clear that we have much to celebrate. Our admissions numbers continue to increase; last year eighteen fifth graders walked through our doors on opening day. Year by year, we see an increase in applicants as our board members Bernadette Souza, Gail Fortes and Helena Hughes -- as well as our growing cadre of enthusiastic alumnae -- help spread the OSS word throughout the community.

Over the recent academic year, we fine-tuned our teaching model to serve our students more effectively. In response to the manifold challenges of teaching incoming students -- who in many cases lack fundamental learning skills -- the Board voted to add professional teachers to the staff. Our remarkable crew of local volunteers continues to grow, contributing much-needed support in all areas of the school. This year also saw the dawn of the Parent Liaison, a voice in the OSS community for the parents of our students. Our graduating class set off on the next leg of their educational voyage with customary distinction. Several students received full scholarships at outstanding independent schools such as Falmouth Academy, Phillips Exeter Academy & Tabor Academy. Others are attending New Bedford Vocational-Technical School or New Bedford High School. Wherever they are, we are confident that OSS has given them the skills they will need to meet future educational challenges and nurtured in them a love of knowledge that will last a lifetime.

Other accomplishments of the past year:

The finance committee, under Business and Operations Manager Carlene LeBlanc, has kept the school on course and within its operating budget, by no means an easy feat. The committee also recommended that The CommonFund be appointed manager of a portion of the school's Sustainability Fund. Although the task of raising our annual budget remains daunting, the Advancement Committee and Director of Development Abby Magni continue to find creative ways to remind the Board and the community of the importance of investing in New Bedford and the South Coast through generous support of OSS.

The year has also seen several transitions:

Two of our most effective and committed board members resigned their positions. The contributions of JoAnn Tschaen, who served as vice president of the board from its inception, and Toby Baker are immeasurable. As members of the founding board of the school, they have been wise, vigilant and inspirational in their leadership. New Bedford and OSS could not have had more passionate advocates.

Seeking a new Head of School, the Search Committee did an outstanding job, spending six months reviewing resumes and interviewing highly qualified applicants. Last December, the Board met and voted unanimously to hire Sarah Herman. Sarah officially signed on during the first week of July 2013. She has said that her main objective at OSS is to “polish the jewel” that already exists. And for the existence of that shiny jewel we have to acknowledge the outstanding leadership of Lisa Yates, who left OSS in July to become principal of the Pacheco School in New Bedford. The board recognizes Lisa’s enormous contributions in building the foundations of OSS. With the wind at her back and her hand firmly on the wheel, Lisa guided OSS steadfastly throughout its five formative years.

A tremendous thanks to all our supporters for contributing with passion and diligence to the welfare of the school and for believing that education truly changes the lives of our students, their families and our entire community. Your investment in Our Sisters’ School continues to provide a safe and supportive environment for building life-long learners.

Our alumnae have visited OSS throughout the school year tutoring, mentoring and sharing stories of their high school adventures. We are proud to share we had 50% of our graduates back to OSS this winter for an alumnae gathering. Thank you Mrs. Knight for all you have done to prepare the Class of 2013 and provide fun opportunities for our graduates to stay connected. Of course, I'll stay connected too!

Thanks to the diligence and dedication to student recruitment, Ms. Santiago helped coordinate the first ever School Choice Fair at the Andrea McCoy Recreation Center providing city students the chance to learn about all the different schools in our community. Thank you, Ms. Santiago for always promoting OSS in our community. Connecting with our community and spreading the good word about OSS is a big part of what makes our work possible.

The crew of OSS volunteers grew this year with 50 new volunteers. Ms. Penny recruited and trained volunteers in the office, as tutors, as lunchroom helpers, and as sports instructors. Thank you to all of you who have given your time to our school and to Ms. Penny for growing our program this year.

This year the OSS basketball team was established; players had a chance to compete in intramural games with four local middle schools. Ms. Canastra built a team of interested students, practiced hard, and held scrimmages in preparation for the BIG games. Thank you, Ms. Canastra for giving our students the chance to show OSS pride and be responsible competitors! Go TEAM OSS!

Tuesday mornings the OSS hallways were alive with song, thanks to the vision of Ms. Brown for an OSS chorus. For the first time in school history, the OSS chorus met weekly, rehearsed endlessly and has performed throughout the year at school, and in the community.

Our 2012 flurry of activity was punctuated by the appointment of our new Head of School, Sarah Herman. Applications from over twenty-five candidates were considered, representing a wide range of backgrounds, educational philosophies and experiences, and the unanimous feeling was that Sarah's passion for educating girls, her commitment to diversity, and her strengths as an inspiring mentor made her the best choice. Sarah has the necessary experience and endless energy to, in her words, "polish the jewel of OSS." She has been searching for a school leadership position where she can work with underserved populations in a school with a clear mission, a commitment to diversity and a student-centered approach to education. She speaks Spanish fluently and is also excited about becoming part of the New Bedford community.

This report is bittersweet for me as I celebrate the schools accomplishments, next steps, and bid farewell to the students, families, staff, teachers, volunteers and many friends of OSS. It has been an honor to serve as the founding Head of School; I will look back on this voyage with great pride and am humbled by the endless support of so many. Thank you to ALL of you who have been a part of the journey, it is my hope you will stay on board for many years to come, the students and school need your expertise, experience and support.

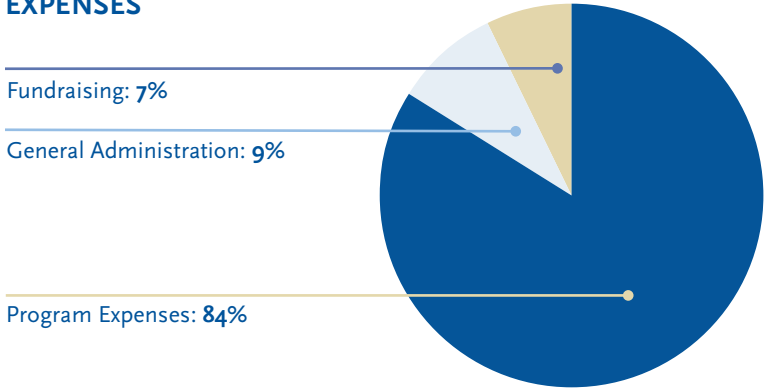

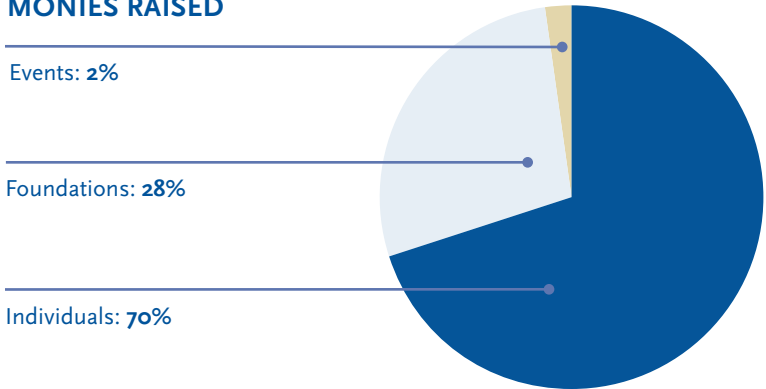
OSS FINANCIAL SUMMARY
