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# Introduction

The Massachusetts Commission on the Status of Women is an independent agency that exists to provide a permanent, effective voice for women across Massachusetts. The mission of the MCSW is to advance women toward full equality in all areas of life and to promote their rights and opportunities. The MCSW is empowered to study, review and report on the status of women in the Commonwealth. Under this charge, the Commission seeks to provide and/or advocate for more gender disaggregated data in Massachusetts, and connect this vital research to those who can use it to create positive change. This report is a thorough compilation of the available and most current data on Massachusetts women and girls. This report offers invaluable county level information, which has not been previously compiled collectively.

This report is based on “The Status of Women by County” research guide created by the National Institute for Women’s Policy Research. The model, which builds off the success of the IWPR’s national “Status of Women” reports (including the one published in 2002 for MA), includes various research topics pertaining to women’s issues and provides a framework for compiling the data into a comprehensive report.

The majority of the data in this report is from the U.S. Census Bureau’s Decennial Census 2000. The information on the self-sufficiency standard is from a report, *The Self-Sufficiency Standard for Massachusetts*, by Diana Pearce, Ph.D. and Jennifer Brooks (published in 2003 by Diana Pearce and Wider Opportunities for Women). The public health statistics are from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health’s Massachusetts Community Health Information Profile. High school drop-out rates are from the Massachusetts Department of Education, available at <http://www.doe.mass.edu>. And finally, state information on voter participation and turnout are from the U.S. Census Bureau’s Current Population Survey, November 2004.

This report was made possible through the hard work, dedication and perseverance of many people. The MCSW would like to thank everyone who contributed their time and effort to create this report. In particular, special acknowledgement and thanks go to Molly Mead, Lincoln Filene Professor at the Jonathan M. # Executive Summary



## Basic Demographics

- Women comprise 51.82% of the population in Massachusetts.
- Twenty three percent of the female population in Massachusetts lives in Middlesex County, the most populous in the state. Nantucket County is the most sparsely populated county with only 0.14% of the female population.
- The vast majority of women in Massachusetts (an average of 81.75%) identify themselves as white, or of European ancestry. In Suffolk County, however, only 57.11% of the female populations identifies as white—a difference of 24.64% from the state average. Additionally, 23.26% of the population identifies themselves as African-American and 15.10% of the population identifies themselves as Hispanic or Latina. These percentages are much greater than in any other Massachusetts county, illustrating that Suffolk County is the most diverse county in the state.
- Women are the heads (with no husband present) 11.86% of Massachusetts households. Suffolk County has the largest percentage of female-headed households at 16.27%.
- Barnstable County has the greatest percentage of women over age 70 at 18.94%. In Massachusetts as a whole, only 12.18% of women are over age 70.

# Earnings and Employment

- Many Massachusetts women (39.55%) are not in the labor force—relative to the female population, but not other states. In Barnstable County, as many as 43.95% of women choose to stay at home. The state low is in Nantucket County, where only 25.99% of women do not participate in the labor force.
- Women in Massachusetts earn less than men in every county. In most counties, the ratio of female annual earnings to male annual earnings is similar with one notable exception: in Suffolk County, women's annual earnings to men's earnings (roughly \$22,871 to \$27,465 in 1999) were significantly more equitable than anywhere in the state.
- Along with sex, the race of an individual makes a significant difference on their earnings as well. Earnings according to race were very distinct to each county. In Barnstable, Bristol and Norfolk County, Native American women had the highest earnings; in Berkshire County, Asian-American women earned significantly more than other women; in Franklin and Hampshire County African-American women had the biggest median earnings. There was no county where Hispanic or Latina women had the highest income. In fact, in 10 out of 14 counties, Hispanic or Latina women had the lowest median earnings out of any racial group.
- Women own 26.6% of firms in Massachusetts. Hampshire County has the largest percentage (32.4%) of women-owned firms.
- It is also Hampshire County, however, that has the lowest median income of female workers. Female workers in Hampshire County had a median annual income of \$15,474 in 1999—\$6,980 less than the Massachusetts average (\$22,454). Women in Norfolk County had the highest median income of \$27,042.



## Poverty and Self-Sufficiency

- The federal poverty line, which is defined as three times the annual cost of a nutritionally adequate diet, varies depending on family size. For example, for a family of three the poverty line is \$16,000 and for a single person it is \$9,800—an increasingly conservative estimate of poverty. According to the federal standard, however, 10.06% of women and girls in Massachusetts are living in poverty, but this varies widely by county. For example, in Suffolk County 19.49% of women are below the poverty line, while in Norfolk County it is only 5.21%.
- Poverty disproportionately impacts young girls. While 19.49% of women live in poverty in Suffolk County, 24.02% of girls under 5 live under the poverty line. The one county where this trend does not apply is Nantucket County; where, only 2.40% of girls under 5 live in poverty in contrast to 8.12% of women.
- Female-headed families with no husband present are much more likely to live below the poverty line. Hampden County presents a striking example: 31.99% of families with a female householder (no husband present) live in poverty, much more than in any other county in the state.
- The necessary income for self-sufficiency also varies greatly between each county. In Berkshire County, a single adult would only need an annual income of \$14,449-\$14,583 to be self-sufficient. In Norfolk County, though, a single adult would need \$23,928-\$24,407 to be self-sufficient.
- The necessary income for self-sufficiency depends greatly on whether a woman has children. A single mother with two children—one in pre-school and the other in elementary school—would need \$34,876-\$35,160 to be self-sufficient in Berkshire County and \$51,284-\$55,373 to be self-sufficient in Suffolk County. The necessary income for a single mother with children to be self-sufficient is often higher than the average woman's earnings.



# Education

- There are 31,400 women over the age of 25 in Massachusetts who have had no formal schooling (roughly 1.38%). Moreover, 15.09% of women in Massachusetts have not received a high school diploma. In Bristol County, a state high of 26.47% of women over age 25 have not attained a high school diploma. It is also Bristol County that has the lowest percentage of women with doctorate degrees—0.29%.
- Throughout Massachusetts, there are more women with professional degrees than men (10.25% to 9.26%). Men, however, have much higher percentages of doctorate degrees than women (2.37% to 1.12%).
- More women over the age of 25 in Nantucket and Dukes County have bachelor's degrees than anywhere else in the state—28.33% and 28.53% respectively. Overall in Massachusetts, 18.99% of women have bachelor's degrees. Hampshire County also has the biggest percentage of women with doctorate degrees at 3.14%.
- The average public high school drop-out rate for girls in Massachusetts is very low at 2.79%. The counties with the highest drop-out rates for girls are Hampden at 5.23% and Suffolk at 5.28%. Dukes County also stands out with the lowest drop-out rate in the state of 0.77%.



## Health and Wellness

- There are 4,495 women in Massachusetts living with HIV or AIDS and 27.74% of them live in Suffolk County, despite that Suffolk County only has 10.90% of the population of Massachusetts women.
- Statewide, 19.40% of women are regular smokers and 26.40% of women are former smokers. Berkshire has the largest percentage of women who are either smokers or former smokers; only 43.2% of women have never smoked. In Suffolk County, however, 61.50% of women have never smoked, the smallest amount of women in the state.
- In Massachusetts, 13% of all weapon-related injuries between 2000 and 2002 were sustained by women. In Norfolk County, this figure was only 6.90%; but in Essex County 16.90% of weapon-related injuries were sustained by women.
- The rate of deaths from breast cancer in the state of Massachusetts is 26.9 per 100,000 women. These rates were very similar from county to county. In every county in the state, with the exception of Nantucket, Hampden and Essex County, the rate of breast cancer deaths were higher among African-American women than any other race group. Breast cancer rates of Hispanic and Asian-American women, however, were generally lower than other races.

## Reproductive Health

- In the state of Massachusetts, 5.90% of all births were to adolescent mothers under the age 20. In Hampden County, however, there was a much higher percentage of births to adolescent mothers at 12.60%.
- Of these adolescents, 11.20% of mothers ages 10-17 smoked during pregnancy and 15.70% of mother ages 18-19 smoked during pregnancy in the state of Massachusetts. It is a significant problem in both Barnstable and Berkshire County, where an average of 34% of teen mothers smoked during pregnancy.
- This was also a significant problem not only for teen mothers, but also mothers over age 20 in Berkshire County. In the year 2004, 20.40% of all new mothers in Berkshire County had smoked during their pregnancy. This is sharply different from the percentage of all Massachusetts women who had smoked during their pregnancy (7.40%).
- Infant mortality rates were highest in Hampden County, where 7.7 of babies died per 1000 births in the year 2002. In Franklin County, however, there were no infant deaths in the year 2002. The State average is 4.9.
- In the state of Massachusetts, 16.50% of mothers in the year 2004 did not receive prenatal care in their first trimester. In Hampden County, this was even worse with 26.50% of mothers not receiving prenatal care, as opposed to Worcester County where only 6.20% of mothers did not receive any prenatal care during their first trimesters.
- Publicly funded prenatal care also had a significant impact in Massachusetts. 30.60% of mothers in 2004 received prenatal care that was funded by the government. It was again in Hampden County where this made the most significant difference, with 52.90% of mothers receiving these benefits.



# Gerontology

- Women over age 65 are much more likely to live below the poverty line in Massachusetts. This is especially pronounced in Suffolk County where 18.6% of women ages 65-74 and 20.10% of women over age 75 live in poverty.
- In the state, 9.40% of women over age 65 are working. Many more women work over age 65 in Nantucket County than any other county in the state (18.36%).

# Political Representation and Participation

- Overall, there is a significant gap between women's numbers in the population and their representation in government.
- In Massachusetts, no woman has ever served as a United States Senator. Currently, there are no women serving in the United States House of Representatives. There have only been 3 women ever elected as U.S. representatives to the House and none have been elected after 1983.
- At the state level, women in Massachusetts are represented by the Senate, of which 30% are women, and the House which is 22.5% female.
- Voter registration and turnout is much higher in years of presidential elections for Massachusetts women. In comparison to the 2000 election, however, women's registration and voter turnout generally increased in 2004. The only exception was that, in 2000, 52.3% of women ages 45-64 voted and in 2004 it decreased to 49.0%.
- In general, women under age 65 had higher levels of voter registration and voter turnout than men. For people over age 65, though, the percentage of men registering to vote and voting was higher than the percentage of women.



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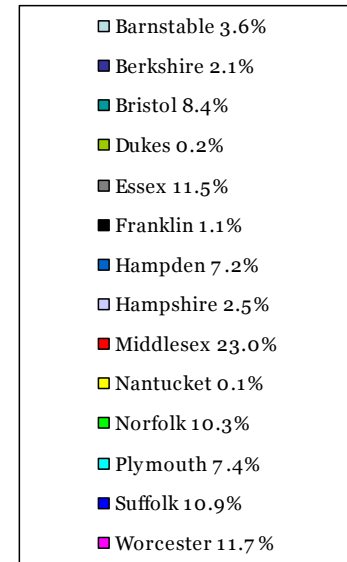
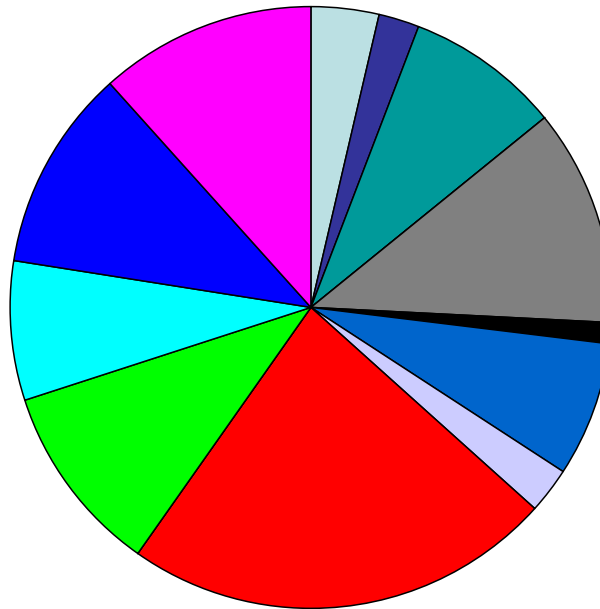

# Distribution of Female Population

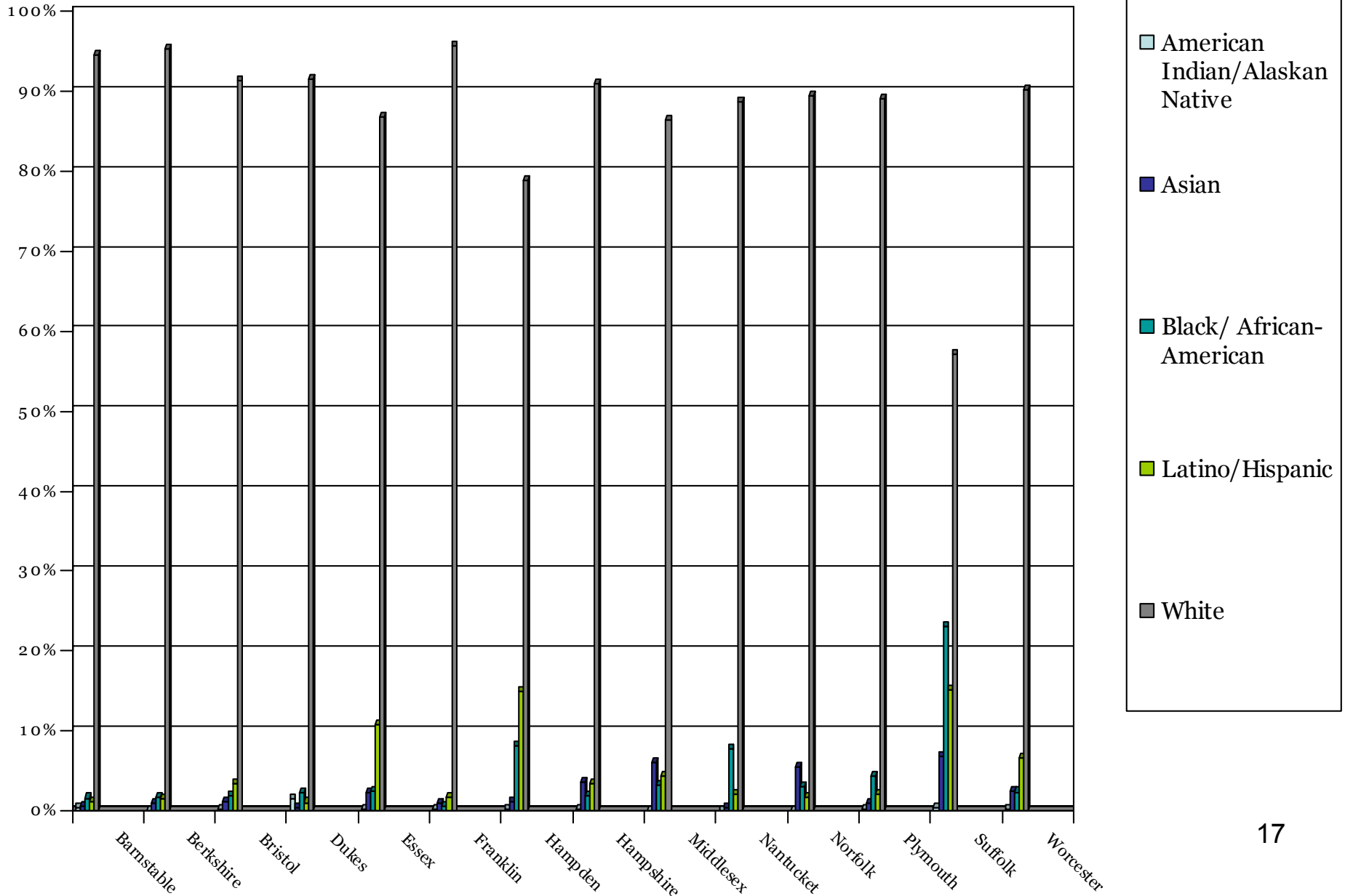

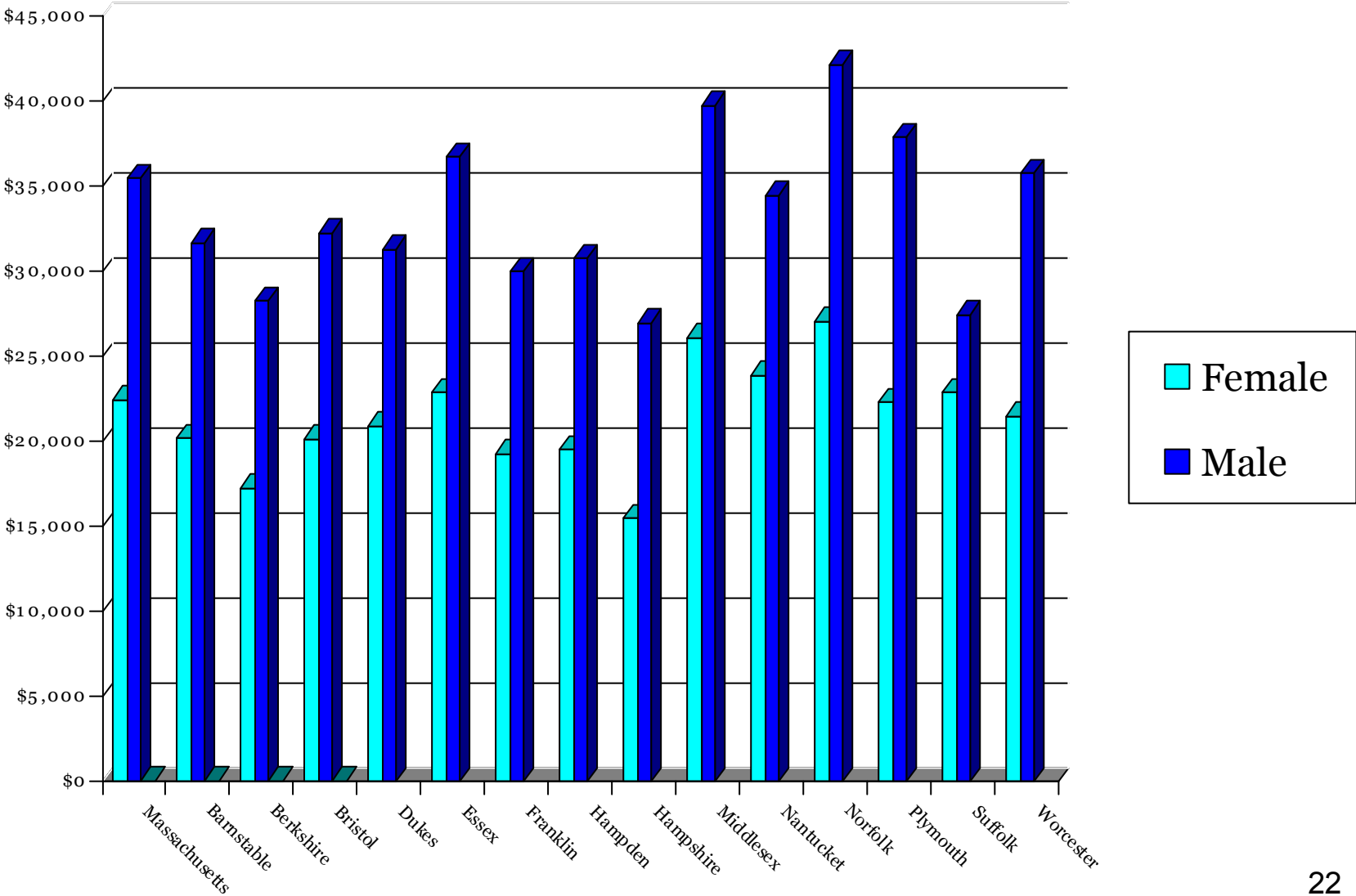

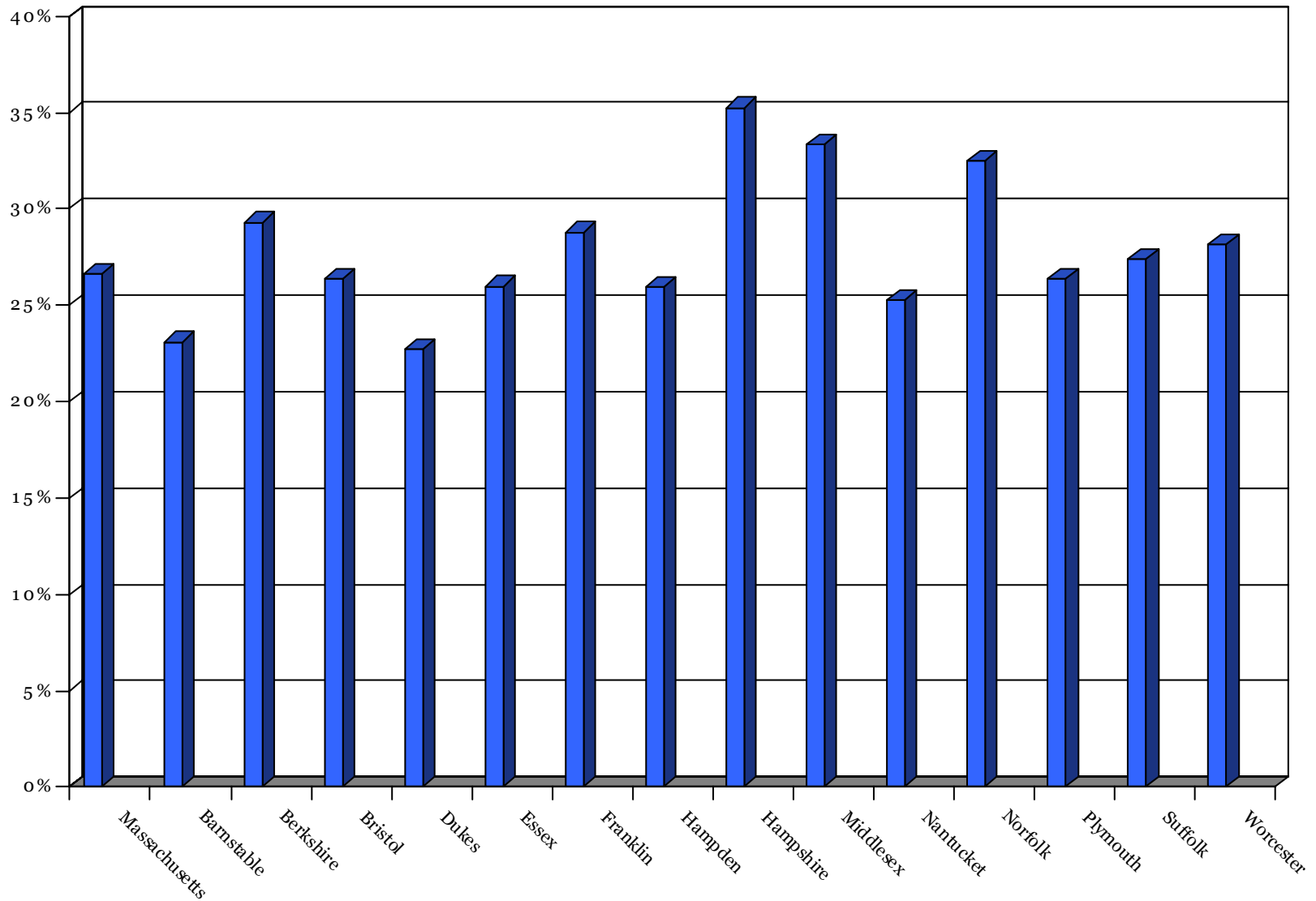

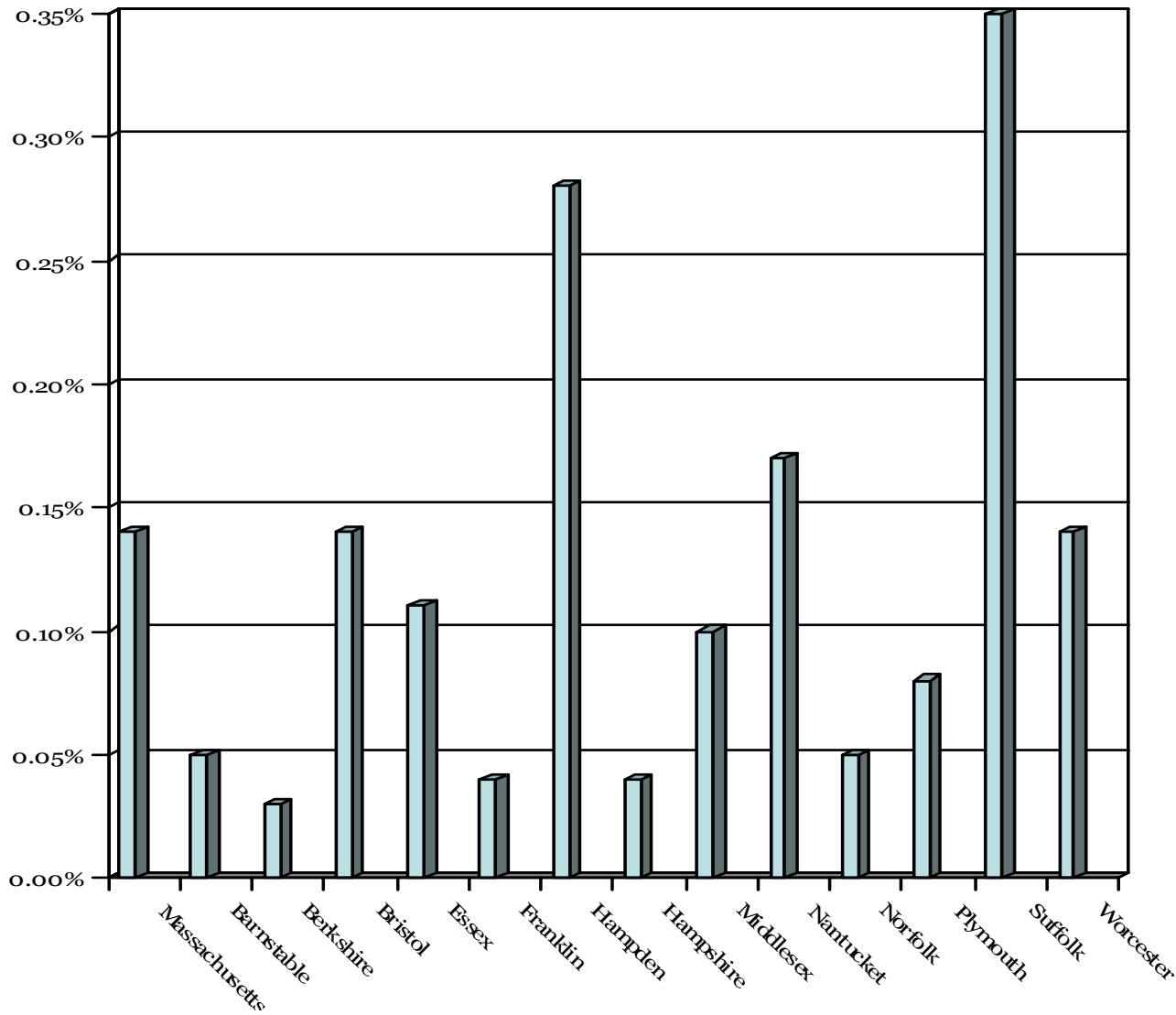

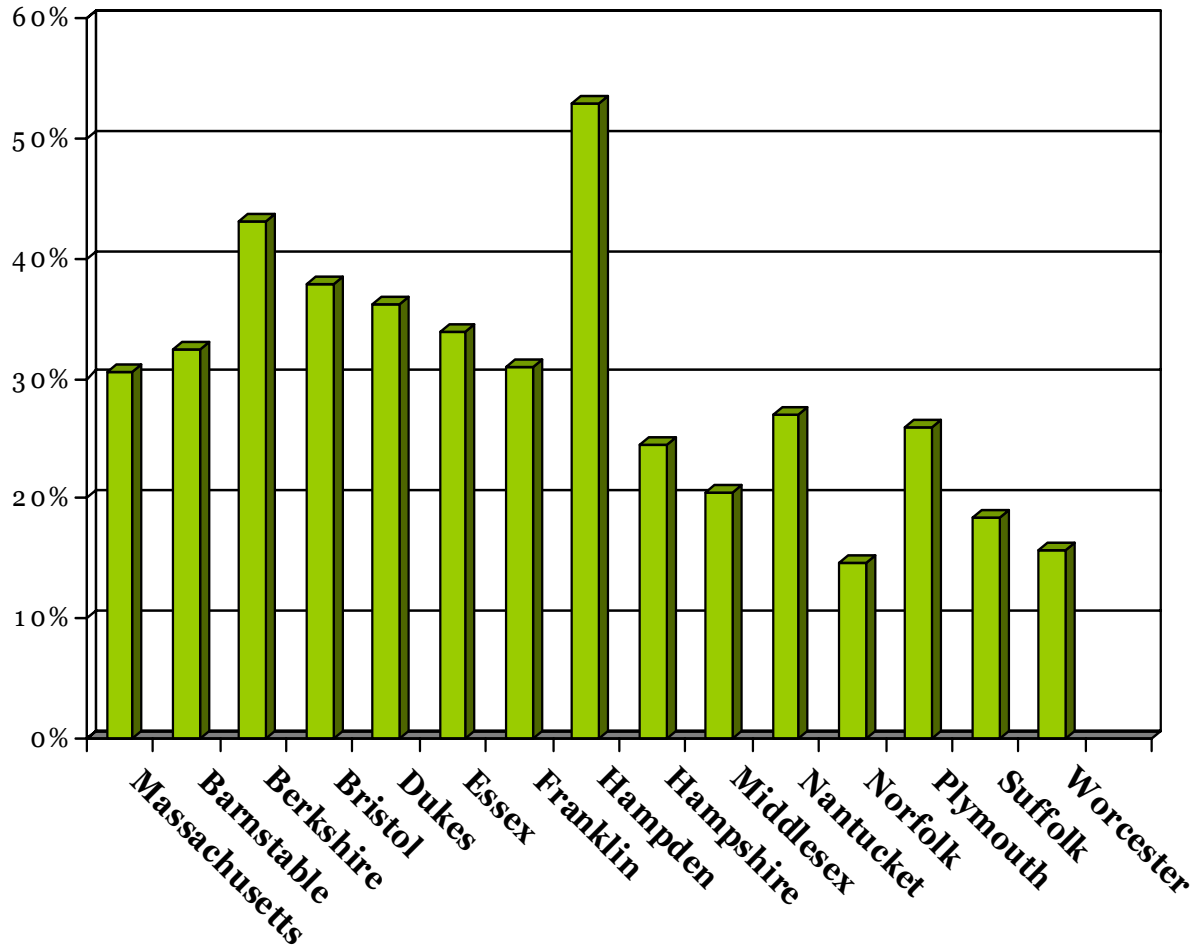

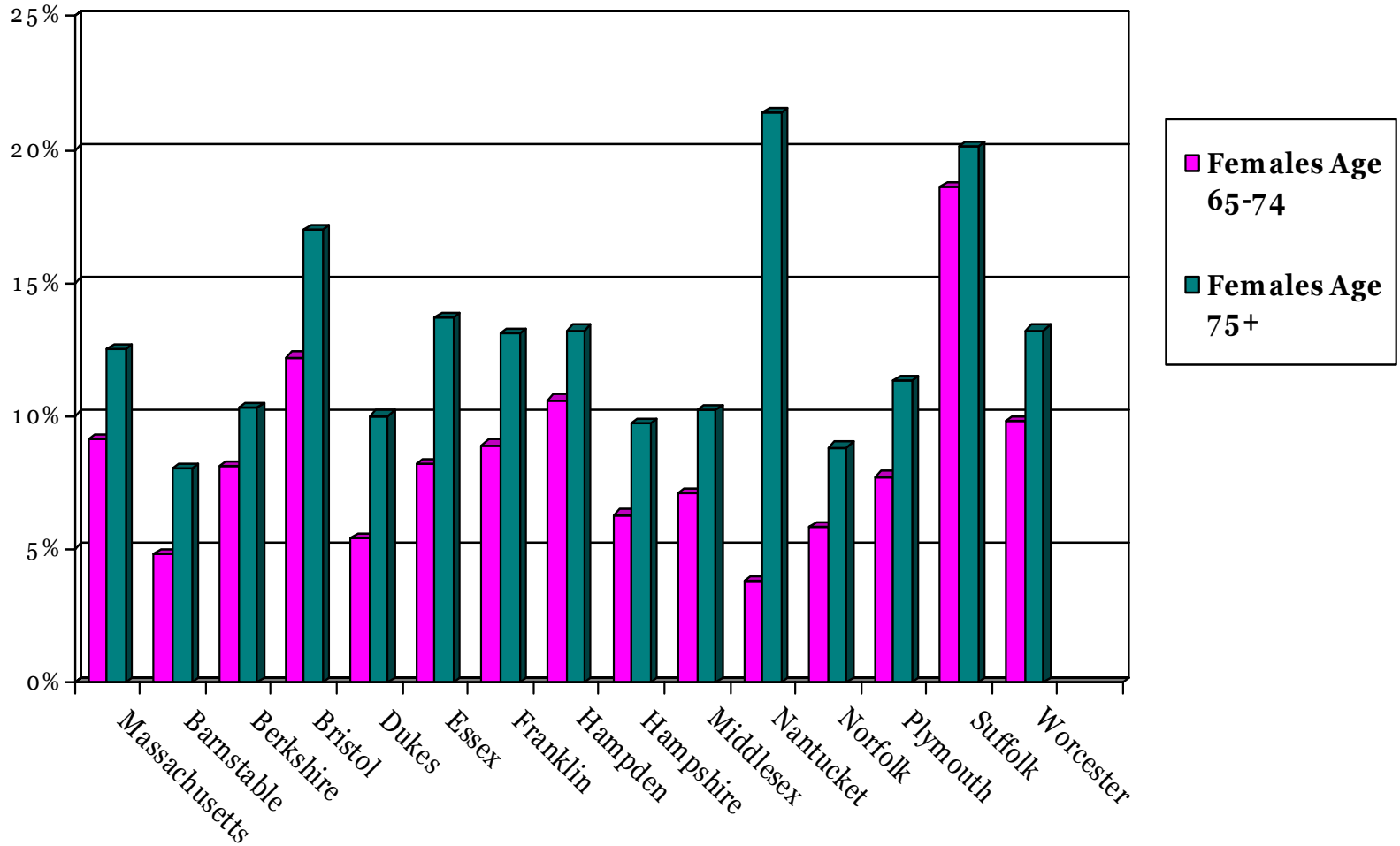

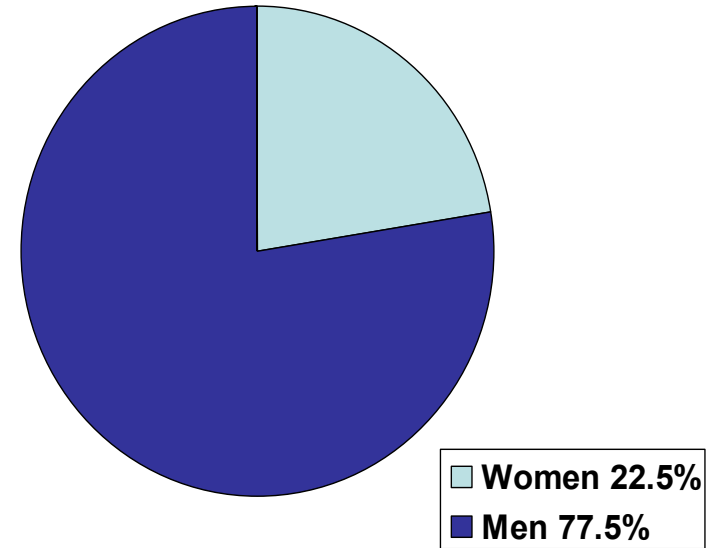

# State Representation by Gender

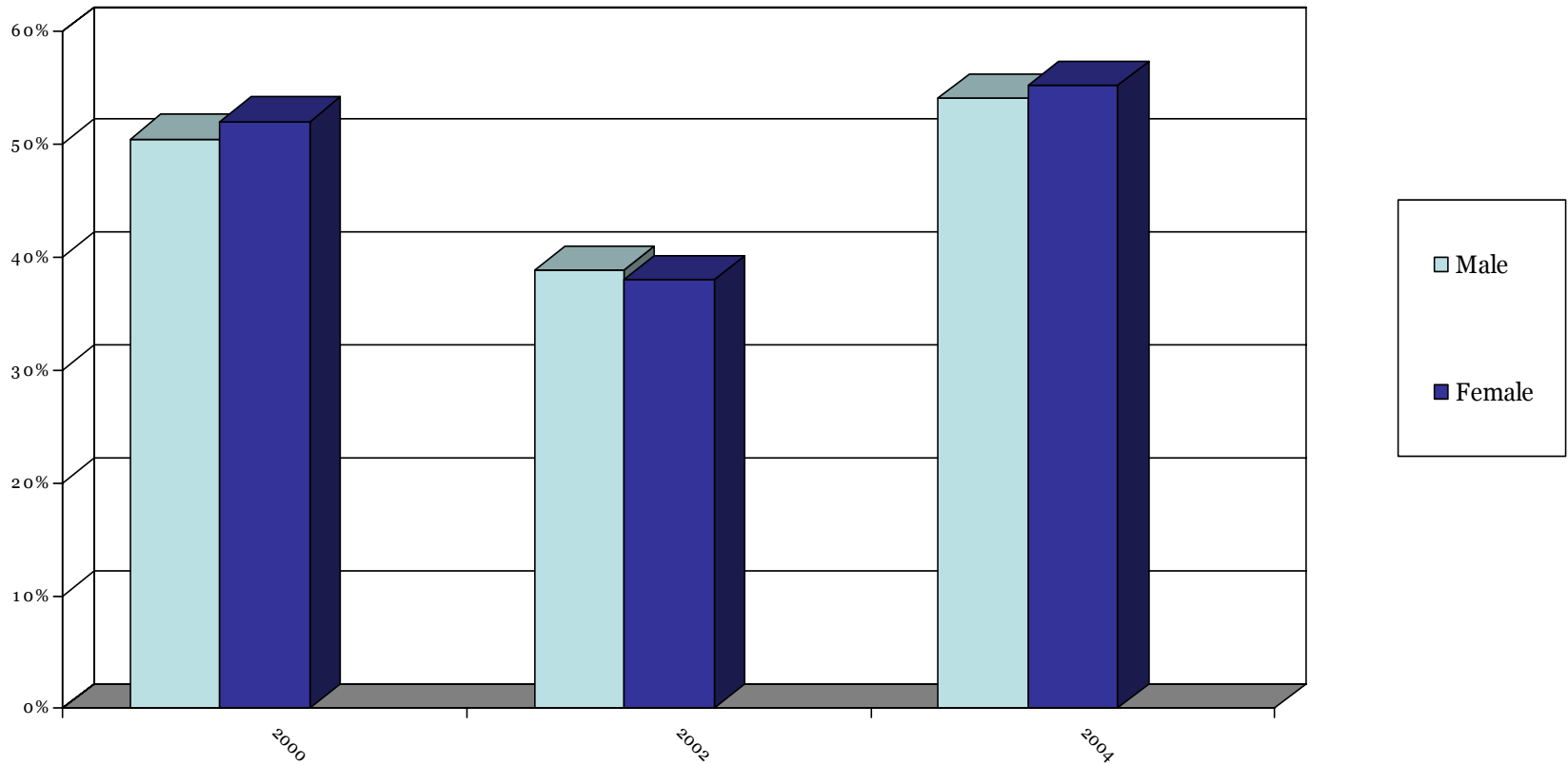
State Senate
